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General Behavior Guidelines: Each student will be expected to show proper conduct in this classroom at all time. Each student will respect the rights and differences of others in this classroom. No food or drinks (except water) are allowed in the classroom and absolutely no iPods, cell phones, or other electronic devices are permitted in class. No one has the right to interfere with anyone's opportunity to learn.

Materials: Notebook, Pencil and a Calculator. If you wish, you may store a binder in the class cabinet.

Preparation: Be prepared. Completion of ALL class work and homework is essential. Being prepared gives you the opportunity to succeed on tests and quizzes. Not being prepared leads to poor performance and missing points.

All students will be held accountable for having their materials in class every day. A portion of the student's grade will be based on being prepared for class.

Tardiness: Show up on time. Upon entering this class late, you must present a valid pass, otherwise you will be considered tardy. *"Any unexcused tardy to a class which exceeds three minutes will be considered an unexcused absence from class"* (Handbook). Students who consistently show up late to class will receive a phone call home and/or a referral depending on the number of violations.

Honesty: Be honest. The NVHS Academic Honesty Policy is followed. Read it and understand it.

Daily Assignments and Homework: You will have regular class work/homework assignments. It may be in the form of worksheets that relate topics discussed in class. Incomplete class work must be completed for homework.

- ❖ You will receive between 0 and 10 points for each homework check. Points are based on completion and accuracy of the work.

Make-Up Work: If you are absent for any reason, it is YOUR responsibility to find out what was missed. You will have one day for each day absent to make up work assigned during your absence. Any work assigned before your absence is due upon your return. For prearranged absences, including field trips, you will not be given extra days to make up missed work! Work missed due to unexcused absences will receive an automatic zero. Late work can receive at most 90% credit, but it is at teacher's discretion to decide whether or not to accept any late work. Please read the handbook regarding suspensions.

Final Semester Grade Evaluation: Each final semester grade is calculated from the semester grades (80%) and the final exam (20%).	

Quizzes and Tests: Quizzes and tests will cover material that has been discussed in class and materials presented in handouts. We will be taking a test or a quiz every Friday. I do expect you to be able to take ideas from each unit and apply them to new situations. They will be composed mostly of free response questions, and you will be expected to show all of your work on your exams. Unless you are told otherwise, all quizzes/tests are closed notes. Calculator memories may be cleared on exam days.

Students who miss a test/quiz due to an absence will be expected to take it the day they return to class. Students who are absent on a review day, which is usually the day immediately preceding a test, will still be expected to take the test when they return to school the next day.

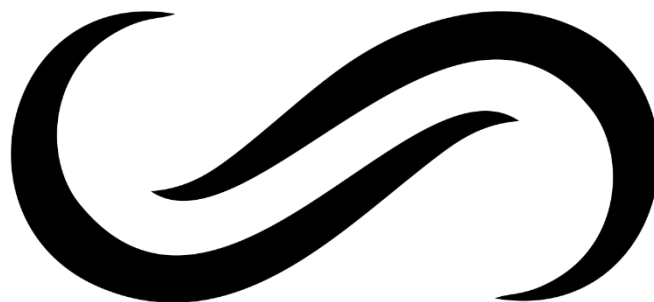
Students who miss two or more “non-review” days – that is, days in which I teach a new lesson – will have one week to make up their test/quiz. After one week, any further delay in test-taking will result in the drop of one letter grade on that assessment for every day the exam is postponed.
